

You are invited to join us in observing the 40 days of Lent this year

Wednesday 14 February - Saturday 30 March

Lent is how many people commemorate Jesus' 40 days fasting in the desert before He began His public ministry. It is a period of repentance and restraint before the great celebration of Easter. It is an opportunity to spend time with God and discover *something more* as we follow Jesus together.

Why fast?

'Ultimately we fast simply because we want God more than we want anything this world has to offer us.'

Why read Hebrews?

This is a fascinating book. It explores the key themes of Jesus' superiority over all creation, God's gracious offer of forgiveness, and the comfort of Jesus in suffering. It is all about how God offers us something more, something better.

Here are 3 ways you could join in with observing Lent this year

- 1. Use DAY during your day (Devote, Ask, Yield) *leedsvineyard.org/day*
 - During the *Devote* section of your day, read the passage from Hebrews for that day
 - During the *Ask* section of your day, you could include our *something more* prayer (on the back page)
- 2. Record your reflections or questions so that you can continue to pray through them or to bring them to your Growth Group
- 3. Fast (there are lots of ideas at *leedsvineyard.org/fasting*)





The main message of Hebrews

Jesus is the clearest, fullest, and most ultimate revelation of God, and He is worthy of total trust and devotion. Following Jesus means remaining faithful to Him, despite persecution because God will not abandon His people.

Who Wrote the Book of Hebrews?

Although it is possible that Barnabas, Paul, or Apollos wrote the letter to the Hebrews, the author is not explicitly mentioned in the text.

Context

The events described in Hebrews take place primarily in the occupied lands of the Greco-Roman empire. Hebrews was composed between 60 and 70 AD, likely during Nero's persecution of the Church.

Literary Styles

The book of Hebrews is a letter written in prose discourse to a church community. It assumes that this community understands and knows the Old Testament.

Key Themes

- · Jesus' superiority over all creation
- God's gracious offer of forgiveness
- · The comfort of Jesus in suffering

Structure

Hebrews has five parts. Jesus is compared to angels and the Torah in 1-2, to Moses and the promised land in 3-4, to the priests and Melchizedek in 5-7, and to sacrifices and the covenant in 8-10. 11-13 are a challenge to follow Jesus no matter the cost.
